PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As my two-year term as President comes to an end, I can reflect on this amazing experience as an enriching opportunity to work with and serve our member endocrinologists across Canada. I am so grateful to all our CSEM volunteer members for their engagement this year, and I confidently anticipate my next role as Past-President. I give special thanks to Inika Anderson, our Executive Director, who has helped us advance our mission, enabled CSEM to take on new roles and activities, and supported me in my position.

For a second year in a row, I can say we have never been busier. Our pivot to virtual education, meetings, and conferences has been incredibly successful. CSEM is now routinely providing excellent online education and professional development opportunities with tremendous participation by you, our members. Our industry partners have been extremely keen to support accredited education with speakers from across Canada and international experts such as Drs. Auchus and Anawalt speaking on androgen misuse and abuse in June.

To be responsive and reflective of our membership, we also presented educational sessions in both official languages. The <u>Cushing's Disease symposium</u> was offered this September in French, and twice in English to enhance participation from different time zones.

I was very proud of our first Research and Discovery Day, this October. Chaired by Dr. Donna Vine, the outstanding program featured superb speakers and spotlighted our recent CSEM award winners. Established faculty updated us on their work alongside our future researchers exploring new avenues of discovery. While the inspiration for this symposium was the 100th anniversary of the Canadian discovery of insulin, we intend to make this an annual event.

Despite its abbreviated form, the first virtual Diabetes Canada/CSEM Professional Conference in 2020 was a tremendous success. I missed seeing and interacting with you all, and yet I came away so impressed with the program. My personal highlights included the very polished clinical vignette presentations by our upand-coming endocrine residents. Many thanks to Dr. Stan Van Uum who chaired our CSEM planning committee and to Dr. Breay Paty who led the planning of the annual residents' day course along with our resident representative, Dr. Nadia Moledina.

Drug shortages have been a recurrent challenge for endocrinologists and patients recently. CSEM now monitors for shortages and discontinuations of medications that are important to our practice. We collaborate with Health Canada and manufacturers to advocate for uninterrupted access to these medications for Canadian patients. The Drug Shortages & Safety section on our website is updated regularly with new information as we receive it.

CSEM's global collaborations include the <u>International Society of Endocrinology</u>. Notably, Dr. Jean-Patrice Baillargeon served on the program organization committee of the Argentina virtual 2021 International Congress of Endocrinology. We also liaise with the Endocrine Society, nominating members for their annual Global Leadership Academy.

A key CSEM function is our role as an <u>accredited provider</u> of CPD for the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. Due to the pandemic, CSEM's reaccreditation has been postponed twice and is now scheduled for December 2021. Lots of work goes on behind the scenes; Dr. Céline Huot, as chair of our CPD committee, continues to ensure we are ready for our review.

All this work is possible thanks to the dedication of our CSEM members who volunteer their time in many ways—on council, on committees, as program reviewers, speakers, and moderators. My sincere thanks to all of you. Your commitment, combined with the support of our partners and corporate sponsors, allows us to continue offering excellent educational programs. And thanks to the engagement of our members, the commitment of our Executive, Council, and Committees, and dedicated staff management, I am pleased to report that CSEM is in excellent shape and ready to further advance our mission.

My final duty as CSEM President is to pass the torch to our new CSEM President Dr. Stan Van Uum from London, Ontario. We look to 2022 with optimism and enthusiasm.
